

WINGS 2026 Adventurer's Guild



Windsor Great Park Explorer Trail - Anti-Clockwise

Short route 7.3 km, (4.5 miles) Duration 2 hrs

Long route 8.5 km, (5.3 miles) Duration 2hrs 30 mins

Instructions

1. Watch your time. If short of time take the short route as described in the **Green text**.
2. Follow the route on the map and the instructions, answer the questions and cross off the answers at the bottom of the sheet to reveal a message at the end of the challenge.
3. Go to the toilet before you leave site. The only toilets are at the Post Office in the Village. These should only be used in an emergency.
4. Do Not approach Deer, Cows, horses or dogs off leads. Do Not climb any fences. Do not enter any Private Areas. Enter and leave the Deer Park by the Gates indicated on the map.
5. If you get lost – Head for the Copper Horse Statue and return via the Long Walk,
6. Avoid walking in long grass in the Deer Park. Check for Ticks when you return to site. Do not try to remove the tick yourself. Refer to your Leader or a First Aider.

Start – Swipe out

1. Walk up the Long Walk towards the Copper Horse.

The Long walk is 2.65 miles (4.25km) long. Windsor castle is at one end and the Copper Horse at the other end.

After about 1km, turn right at the crossroads and walk along the path to the Prince of Wales Pond.

Q1 What is the first word in the Yellow section of the warning sign? _____

2. The path joins The Gallop and passes between two oak trees surrounded by tree trunks.

Q2 How many sections of tree trunk surround the left hand (Eastern) tree? _____

3. Continue up the Gallop to the Fence. Go through the Gate on the left to exit the Deer Park.

Q3 What is written on the sign at the side of the road pointing south? _____

4. Follow the road west to the edge of the Village to the sign “Caution Drive Slowly”

Q4 What is the child on the left-hand side of the sign doing? _____

5. Turn left on the Queen Anne's s to the Millstone.

Q5 Who planted the first 1000 trees on Queen Anne's Ride? _____

6. Turn down the track to the phone box.

Q6 Whose silhouette is on the door of the phone box? _____

7. Walk along the road to the Southwest Corner of the Village Green and the Post Office.

Q7 What year was the Post Office Built and who was on the throne? _____

You can buy refreshments here and, in an emergency, use the toilet.

8. Retrace your steps to the bench at edge of Village Green –

Q8 Who is this bench in Memory of? _____

9. Head east out of the village to the crossroads with the Queen Anne's Ride. **There is a great view from here.**



Short Route - If short of time – follow the Short Route Map and Continue straight on to the crossroads, point Q9.

Q9 How many concrete bollards (hemi-spheres) are at this crossroads? _____

Short Route - Head straight on, then turn left onto a horse track to Ox Pond and instruction 13.

10. **Long Route - If Time Permits and you fancy a bigger challenge -Ignore Q9 and follow the Long Route Map which includes Q10, 11, & 12. Turn left up and walk up the Queen Anne's Ride to the Jubilee Statue of the Queen on horseback**

Q10 The statue was presented to Queen Elizabeth II to celebrate which Jubilee? _____

11. **Long Route** - Head east along the road from the statue and take the left fork. Go across the crossroads.

Q11 What written on the Sign located just after the crossroads? _____

12. **Long Route** - Walk past the sign up the hill past a turning on the left to a crossroads with a bench.

Q12 The entrance to whose Lodge is located here? _____

Long Route - Take the path opposite the bench signposted "Horse Riders". Descend through the woods, to Ox Pond on the left.

13. **Both Routes** – From Ox Pond Head up the grass path towards the Copper Horse. Stop at the grass crossroads.

Q13 How many pieces of concrete make up the slab in the centre of this crossroads? - _____

14. Carry on up the hill and go through the gate and up to the Copper Horse.

The statue is made of Bronze not copper and includes metal from melted down cannons.

Q14 On a clear day it is possible to see the arch of Wembley Stadium. Cross off 2 other things you can see from the statue? _____

15. Walk back down the Long Walk towards the castle.

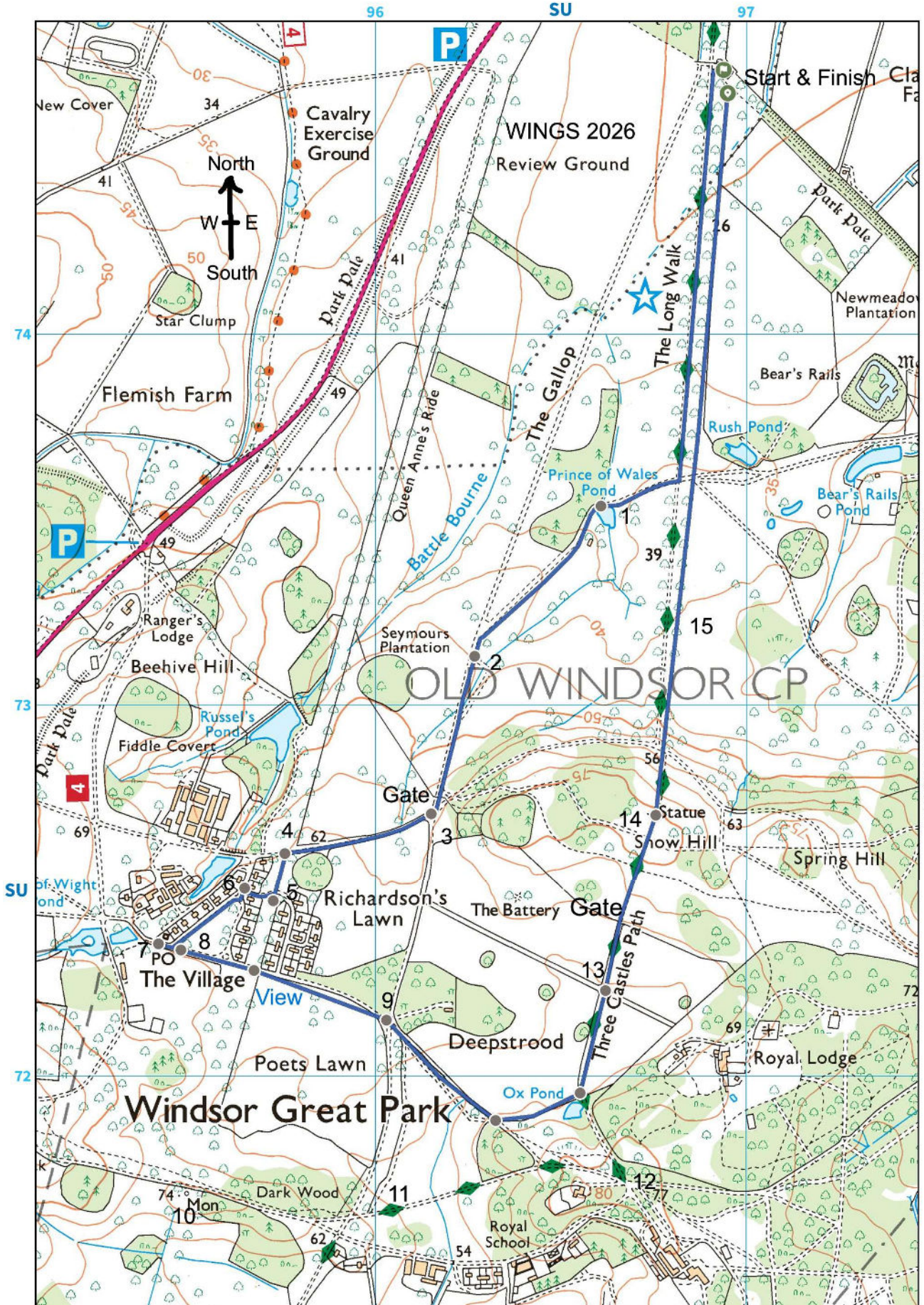
Q15 What type of trees are adjacent to the Long Walk? _____
